

Horton National Cemetery and later in the day at the Branch and Unit 40 Holiday Party. December 18th I attended Unit 40 General meeting. Then On December 21st I drove to Florida to be with my mom while my dad had open heart surgery. I remained in Florida until January 12th assisting with Dad's care and rehab. On January 15th I attended Unit 40's general meeting and made a donation to Vets Kitchen. On January 21st I participated in a ceremony for Lee Jackson King day in Virginia. In February in addition to normal Unit Board and general meetings I attended the East Coast Mid-year meeting in Richmond VA. On March 5th I attended Sailor of the Year event in Hampton Roads, March 7th I spoke at a Navy League Hampton Roads event and the following week I attended Unit 99 meeting. On March 21st Chris and I flew to California to attend the West Coast Mid-year Convention at the home of Unit 8 Vallejo. We stayed over to enjoy a week with the grandchildren living in Monterey CA. Upon returning home April was a busy month with normal Unit meetings, attending Gold Star Wives event on 5 April. And found me back at a scholarship sharing event talking to 1800 sophomore and junior high students about opportunities. We recruited a few for the FRA that day. 

I am thankful and in gratitude to NP Christina Murray, Board of Directors and PNP's for their Support and guidance during my term as National Vice President.

Remarks: Thank you to all the members that recruited or reinstated members, you did an awesome service for the LA FRA. Working with our National President, a special Anniversary Certificate with a congratulation letter was created for MAL's who has reached mile stones on 5-year increments through 45 Years. Those that had 50 Years or more our National President sent them the official certificate with a letter. The following Certificates and letters were sent: 45 Yrs. (8 Members), 40 Yrs. (10), 35 Yrs. (9), 30 Yrs. (7), 25 Yrs. (3), 20 Yrs. (5), 15 Yrs. (2), 10 Yrs. (2), 5 Yrs. (4). Per our NFS, she did get responses from MAL members by them purchasing their anniversary pins. Through this process of the 50 letters sent out, we did discover several of our MAL's have been deceased.

Having a steady loss of memberships have many variables for the decrease to occur, Death (139 Members) is one of them, yet it is a small percentage compared to those that were Suspended (975 Members). Members that are suspended are actually members that did not pay renewal fees. It is a possibility that the majority suspended did not want to continue and/or have loss the purpose or passion to be part of this type of social network. Many other similar organizations are struggling as well with membership. For us, we need to work on adjusting the atmosphere in a Unit meeting or event, allowing our personal attitudes, to be a welcoming support group that works as a unit to make a difference in our veterans' community. At events, be proud of who you are and what the Auxiliary represents, on-lookers see and they listen, they will sense your attitude and respect for others. Just like incoming members, they are sensitive to attitude; they listen of how you talk to or about others; they experience of how the group has respect for each other and they want to know "do they fit in"; is this a safe environment to be human; or is this a place, they have to shut down their hearts. When the time of membership renewal is due, members have the choice, to go where their well-being is fulfilled with passion, being part of a positive social network or leave to protect their own well-being. 
Remarks on work done as Liaison to FRA Today:


