NP Fulton declared that a quorum was present pursuant to Article 8, Section 802(c) (f) of the C&BL of the LA FRA.

All PNP, PRP, PNChaps, PNParls and all RP-E and RVP in attendance were recognized.

NP Fulton welcomed Auxiliary members and guests to the NBOD meeting and reminded them that all members have access to the meeting but have no vote or any privileges of the floor except under the Good of the Order, as time permits. Stated the meeting is an opportunity to accomplish necessary business to help expedite the convention business sessions.

NES Starkey read the inventory for the National Officer's Equipment [Addendums A-E]. There following items were marked for survey:

Unfinished Business:

Ratification of the Regional ByLaws:

None were submitted so no action was taken.

Unit Information:

- A: There were no new Units, and no Units were reactivated.
- B: There were three Units that surrendered their charter during the 2022-2023 Association Year, but it is unknown if they have turned in their charter. The Units are Unit 156 (NE/NEng), Unit 92 (SC), and Unit 90 (SW).
- C: NFS Suckow, PNP, advised the NBOD that she deemed Unit 162 (SC) out of order for failing to submit a valid Unit Officers Report. NFS Suckow, PNP, moved that Unit 162 be suspended for failing to send a valid Officers Report and RPEC Smiley seconded. Discussion was held. Motion carried.

New Business:

NP advised the NBOD that in accordance with Article 7, Section 705(c), the NW Region is currently under suspension. NP Fulton recommended that Helen Courneya, PNP, be appointed as Administrator for the Northwest Region. RPSW Quesnel moved to accept the recommendation that Helen Courneya, PNP, be appointed as Administrator and NFS Suckow, PNP, seconded. Discussion was held. Motion carried.

NES Starkey recommended that the *Triangle* be printed at home to save costs. NES Starkey moved that we print the *Triangle* at home as a cost savings and seconded by RPSE Klase. Discussion was held. Motion carried.

NFS Suckow, PNP, recommended that the 60-day reminder postcards for past due members be stopped as the RPs and RVPs are also contacting the members in arrears. As this is a duty of the NFS as stated in the C&BLs, NP Fulton advised that a resolution needs to be submitted next year.

RPNC Lickteig recommended that there should be training for incoming RPs and RVPs as to what is expected of them.

NP Fulton reminded the Board and members attending of the following:

- Advised the RPs to turn over the first place winners to the NES;

Convention Minutes Publishing Committee Chair Pat Suckow, PNP, presented her report [Addendum #19]. PNP Suckow moved to accept minutes as published and Ronalee Klase, RPSE, seconded, There was no discussion. Motion carried.

Ratification of NBRs and Pre-Convention NBOD Actions:

Chairman Murray explained to the Delegates that the NT's P/S/P budget line was \$400.00. The actual expenses were \$640.41. NBR 13 only added \$129.00 but the actual overage was \$240.41 due to increased postage. Therefore, Chairman Murray moved that the additional overage of \$111.41 be approved by the delegates and NES Starkey seconded. There was no discussion. Motion carried.

Chairman Murray advised that the Committee is recommending a change to SR 14(d) to read "Regional Presidents in attendance at the Post-Board will receive \$400 for travel expenses at the Post-Convention Board of Directors meeting." Chairman Murray, PNP, moved to change SR 14(d) as recommended and Sandra Robbins, PNP, seconded. There was no discussion. Motion carried.

Chairman Murray moved to accept the Budget for 2023-2024 as corrected [Addendum #32] and Ronalee Klase, RPSE, seconded the motion. No discussion was held. Motion was carried.

Remarks on Other Work Done

This year went a lot smoother than the previous period. Brenda and I were beginning to work well together when she suddenly went to the Supreme Commander. May she Rest In Peace. When Pat came onboard we knew each other from many years in the Auxiliary so we didn't have a learning curve. Also with Pat having done the job before she knew what was happening. We balanced on our first monthly and every month thereafter. Our annual report balanced also. I feel we have a good handle on the Auxiliary funds.

As you see from the numbers above, our Receipts dropped by almost half from the previous year. I think this has to do with the economy. I suspect the Auxiliary member dues are very low on someone's budget. I think as long as personal expenses go up and fixed incomes stay the same we will see more and more of a loss of membership. Keep recruiting!! Regional Presidents keep after your Unit Presidents so that when a member's dues lapse, check on them. Since the Unit gets $\frac{1}{2}$ of the dues back to the unit it might be worthwhile if the Unit is able to pay that member's dues until they get back on their feet.

I was finally able to get the PCT account straight so that it could be reconciled. We are still carrying a very high balance on an account that is earning no interest so that is something I will be reviewing in the next year.

One thing I accomplished in this year was to get similar balances in the four main CD's we have. I also was able to arrange for one of them to come due each quarter. With this system if we need money in a quarter we take from the CD that is close to being mature and we pay less in penalties. By having them be 12 month terms we are also earning better interest. This year's total interest on those 4 CD's was \$2,198,72 versus \$283,19 from 2021-22.

I am looking into eliminating the Advance Savings Account. This was where we were putting the beyond 1 year member dues. I guess years ago they felt like they were going to run out of money so they devised the Advance Savings account. I see two problems with this: #1 we are a cash basis tax filer. We claim the money in the year it comes in and the year it goes out. Maintaining an accrual account is not a good thing (for IRS audits). We have quite a bit of money in that account at this time. The second problem is that it is very time consuming for both the NFS and the NT. One month I spent over three hours just recording the advance pays. This is something that will be discussed with the new NP, NFS and NT sometime during the next year, before we make any changes.

The only thing I was able to attend was the SE Region Convention. My health is going downhill and I am limited in what I can and can't do. Doctor's orders prevent me from being at this convention.

Over all, the Auxiliary is in very good shape financially. We will probably run out of members before we run out of money.
