My project is 'Growing Our Membership.' First, concentrate on maintaining the members that we have and then work to increase the membership one member at a time. Most units know there is a problem with membership, we also know that this is an ongoing issue over many years.

What are the biggest challenges in maintaining our membership? 1- moving and not providing the Unit with an address change, this is also a 'returned email address' and 2- forgetting to renew their dues.

Keeping in contact with our members using postal or email newsletters may help members know who to contact about their dues. When a member moves to be close to family or is not computer literate the contact is lost, especially when not attending meetings.

We need to work together to remind members that they are appreciated and that we would appreciate being advised when they move and to remind their family that they are a member of the LA FRA.

One way is using USPS more frequently send a Christmas card or a Valentine card or something every couple of months. The advantage of a first-class mailing instead of a post card is that you should get an address correction notice from the post office.

In addition to reporting deceased members, it is important to remember those who are ill, in the hospital or rehab center; those who have a crisis in the family or just need a special note of phone call to keep in touch.
