Auxiliary Members:

Accepting this position as Parliamentarian will be an experience to consider each member's rights under the rule of the C&BLs. As the Parliamentarian, the job description is not as simple as which one must be acquainted with the Constitution and Bylaws, Standing Rules, and Robert's Rules of Order.

The Constitution and Bylaws for the Auxiliary are an explanation of how our organization operates. The challenges are when it is not covered in the C&BLs, we must revert to Roberts Rules of Order. Parliamentarian procedures simplify how the Auxiliary is to conduct business in a meeting and advice given when the National President and the National Board of Directors as it relates to the Bylaws of the Auxiliary. Membership has responsibilities as well as privileges, as defined in the C&BLs; an order of business is defined in the Standing Rules. Good Leadership and informed membership are directly related to the use of parliamentary procedure and rules of order.

Another aspect of the position is that resolutions must be submitted for parliamentary procedure to comply with provisions of Article 12.

We must remember to be good stewards of the positions we all hold and move the Auxiliary forward in a confident positive institution of the Ladies Auxiliary of the Fleet Reserve Association.

National Chaplain and Unit Chaplains duties are provided by the LA FRA Constitution and By Laws, Standing Rules, and Unit Instructions and Rituals. It is crucial for chaplains to familiarize themselves with the directions and guidelines to successfully fulfill their duties. The C&BL's, Standing Rules, Instructions and Rituals are found online at www.la fra.org.

Chaplains offer the Invocations at Opening and Closing of Ceremonies during meetings and take part in the Initiation Ceremony, Burial Ritual, and Ceremony for the Draping of the Charter, Memorial Service and other Rituals as directed. The Chaplain records deaths and reports them to the National Chaplain, Regional Chaplain and the membership Service Administrator. The Chaplain officiates at the arrangements of the Alter and has charge of the Bible during the meeting and provides spiritual comfort and aid to those in distress. Unit Chaplains are requested to immediately notify the Regional, National Chaplain, and Membership Service Administrator of a deceased member by submitting a completed Notification of Death of a Unit Member, to include name, address and next to kin on deceased form. Deceased members are memorialized during Regional Convention and National Convention,

I am providing an email for all National Chaplain correspondence. Communication from Unit Chaplains will be essential to ensure that all deceased members are memorialized during ceremonies and official records are kept up to date. I look forward to working with Unit Chaplains and delivering support for family members dealing with grief. Thank you and have a blessed year.

My National President's Project for 2024-2025 is "Paws for Purple Hearts". Their mission is to improve the lives of America's Warriors facing mobility challenges and trauma-related conditions such as PTSD and TBI by providing the highest quality Assistance Dogs and canine-assisted therapy programs; and by building public awareness about the Important role dogs play in helping Warriors along the road to recovery.

Paws for Purple Hearts is the world's only service dog organization for wounded Service Members and veterans that partners with Bergin College of Canine Studies. Bergin College is the first and only college in the world that focuses on training and learning about dogs. It was founded and continues to be led by the famous canine researcher and inventor of the service dog concept, Dr. Bonnie Bergin.

Through its unique mission to advance human-canine studies, it produces some of the best service dog trainers and highest quality assistance dogs. Although Paws for Purple Hearts Is now separate from Bergin College- all of their trainers are Bergin graduates.

As an employee at the VA Palo Alto Health Care/Veterans Affairs, I have had the opportunity to witness the facility dogs in action with veteran inpatients. It is quite a moving experience to see the works of these dogs and how they benefit our veterans. This non-profit 501(c)(3) organization is close to my heart.

Here are some fun New Year's Facts and Trivia:

- The earliest recorded festivities in honor of a new year's arrival date back some 4,000 years to ancient Babylon.
- Auld Lang Syne is a Scottish folk song made famous in America by Canadian bandleader Guy Lombardo in the late 1920s.
- Ancient Romans are credited with the <u>kissing tradition</u> because of their Saturnalia festival. It was a celebration honoring Saturn, the god of time.
- American Samoa is the second to last place to celebrate the new year behind Baker and Howland Islands, which are both uninhabited.
- The most common resolution people make is to get healthier.
- Each year, it is estimated that 80 percent of New Year's resolutions are abandoned by February.
- Times Square first hosted a New Year's Eve celebration in 1904 with a giant fireworks show but when city leaders banned fireworks a few years later, the ball drop tradition was born in 1907.
- The idea of a ball "dropping" to signal the passage of time dates back to 1833 when a ball was installed on top of England's Royal Observatory at Greenwich, allowing the captains of nearby ships to precisely set a vital navigation instrument.
- The current ball is a 12-foot sphere that weighs 11,875 pounds and is covered with 2,688 Waterford Crystals
- The ball is illuminated by 32,256 LEDs (light-emitting diodes) and can display a palette of more than 16 million vibrant colors and billions of patterns that create a spectacular kaleidoscope effect.
- At the historic Hershey Press Building in Pennsylvania, a 300-pound, seven-foot-tall Hershey's Kiss is raised three stories.
- The New Year's Eve Pickle Drop started in 1999 with a handful of Mt. Olive Pickle employees and now draws several thousand to the North Carolina town every year. The glowing, three-and-a-half-foot pickle drops from the Mount Olive Volunteer Fire Department's tower truck.
- In Mobile, Alabama a 12-foot, 600-pound electric Moon Pie drops at midnight (even though the sweet treat is made in Tennessee).
- Nashville gets in on the new year fun by dropping a musical note in Music City and of course accompanying the drop.
- Eating black-eyed peas is a southern tradition said to bring economic prosperity in the coming year.
- Find a way to include a round food (think donuts, bagels...) into your New Year's meal. The shape symbolizes that the year has come full circle.
- In Denmark, the Danes throw unused plates that have been saved up throughout the year at the front doors of family and friends for good luck.
- In some Latin American countries, people carefully pick the underwear they wear for the holiday. Yellow enhances your chances for abundance and money. Red means you'll likely find love. And if you were sporting white underpants, preferably new and clean, then peace was your top priority for the coming year.
- To get into the Sea Goddess's good graces, Brazilians jump over the waves seven times.
- In Canada, they do the polar bear plunge to ring in the new year. Fireworks are also set off because it is thought that noise and lights will scare away any evil spirits for the coming months.
- In the Philippines, roundness is thought to signify prosperity, so on New Year's Eve locals surround themselves with round shapes, by wearing polka dots, filling their pockets with coins, or by eating circular fruits.
- It's a common superstition that opening the doors and windows will let the old year out, and the new year in unimpeded.
- In Hawaii, they celebrate with popping firecrackers (to ward off evil spirits), eating noodles (which symbolize longevity), cleaning (so you don't carry your old life into the new year) and, for some local families, pounding mochi.
- In Scotland and Greece, they believe the first person who enters your home in the new year will either bring good or bad luck. Make sure you're careful about who it is and that they walk in using their right foot.
- The Chinese New Year is a festival that lasts fifteen days and starts on a different date every year, following the phases of the moon. It begins with the new moon that usually occurs between the end of January and the middle of February.
